Though I haven't been able to call Pastor Norman Malu in Port Moresby this month, he was scheduled to be in the Highlands about now to hold a revival service at one church and then to travel to another church to teach an extensive course on the book of Revelation for pastors, deacons, and others who desire to attend.

While in North Carolina, it worked out for me to meet up with Cyd and go with her to her doctor's appointment. This was not a regularly scheduled checkup but due to her having many GI symptoms and having more weight loss, we called and asked if there was an opening in October at the clinic there. After tests, it was determined that she has several bacterial infections in her upper digestive tract, which account for a lot of inflammation, fever, and illness. They also found a couple of microscopic parasites still going on that she contracted in Papua New Guinea over a year ago. Her doctor put her on an intensive treatment plan that is making her sicker than the illness itself, yet we hope in the end she will feel a lot better.
